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When I got a smoker a few years back I was reading up on how to smoke different kinds of meats. One site made the bold proclamation "The secret to successful smoking is finding a good butcher." Jamie from the Co-op was my good butcher. Jamie was knowledgeable and he was funny. I laughed very nearly every trip I made to the co-op when Jamie was there.

Eventually we shared phone numbers and he would text me hilarious things and occasionally give me heads up on sales. If I was going to plan a smoke I'd text him and he'd let me know what he had in the cooler. The last time I talked to Jamie in person was in early December. He had a rough go of it in the last year, he had to have a total hip replacement and he had been on leave from the store. I gave him 20-30 pounds of beef because I knew he was going to be out of work for a while and it was the very least I could do to help him. I regret not doing more.

Jamie died on Sunday. I'm not sure how he died but I'm sure he wasn't ready. He had discussed his plans with me on what he wanted to do when he recovered from the surgery. I'm left staring at the last text I received from him..."lol". He had sent me a hilarious meme and we both had a good laugh.

You never know when the last time you'll talk to someone is. Some people come into your life unexpectedly, from an unexpected place, in an unexpected way, and make a difference. That was Jamie.


